AIR PASSENGER RIGHTS REGULATIONS

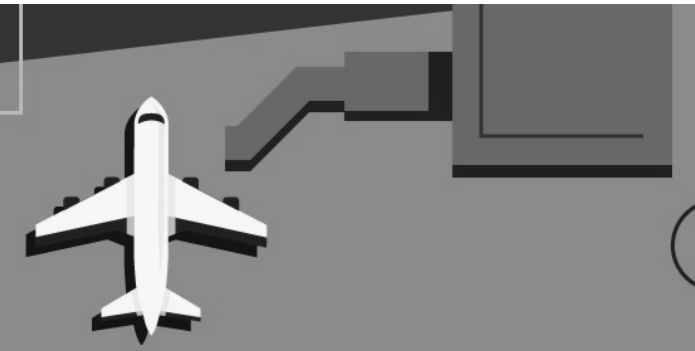
Canadians deserve to know their rights when travelling.
We're taking action to strengthen air passenger rights for travellers.

IMPROVING AIR PASSENGER RIGHTS

Our government is standing up for Canadian travellers to make sure they're treated with fairness and respect.

When Canadians are faced with common travel problems like delays, denied boarding, and lost baggage, they should be confident about what their rights are and what compensation they can receive.

We're requiring all airlines to inform passengers why their flight is cancelled or delayed, and what compensation and recourse is available in return.



Our government has made a lot of progress and the launch of a public consultation brings us one step closer to strengthening air passenger rights for Canadians so everyone can travel with peace of mind.

AIR PASSENGER RIGHTS REGULATIONS

These regulations will establish clear standards of treatment for air travellers in common situations, as well as financial compensation under certain circumstances, such as:

- Denied boarding (including in case of overbooking), delays and cancellations;
- Lost or damaged baggage;
- Tarmac delays over a certain period of time;
- Seating children near a parent or guardian at no extra charge; and

We've taken action to protect air passenger rights and make sure you're compensated if things don't go as planned.

- Ensuring carriers develop clear standards for transporting musical instruments.

The Transportation Modernization Act is now law in Canada. This legislation promotes greater choice and connectivity, lower costs, and strengthened air passenger rights. Our government is standing up for Canadian travellers and ensuring that air travellers are treated with fairness and respect.

It is an important first step in the implementation of Transportation 2030, our government's strategy for the future of transportation in Canada.
